

This is a new feature to help you get to know our members a little better. This month we highlight Arline Coffelt.



If you think the stereotyped motorcycle rider has bulging arms with a skull and crossbones tattoo covered with a leather vest, you need to check out

the Endless Mountains Riders chapter of Wing'd Riders in Sayre, PA. Their oldest member will turn 90 next year, and you can't miss her long red hair flowing out from under her helmet as she drives her



bright red Goldwing trike around the country.

Arline Coffelt lives near Owego, New York and has been riding motorcycles for over 35 years. She and her husband, Richard, wanted to learn how to ride so they took a class offered by Bob's Cycle Shop in Sayre, PA in the late 1980's. She ended up buying that class bike – a 250 – that only had about 1,000 miles on it.

Arline's Pennsylvania classmates got their licenses at the end of the bike class, but since Arline lived in New York, there were additional hoops she needed to jump through, so she and Richard just kept riding with their learner permits. They added a 185 Kawasaki and rode the back roads on Sunday mornings when traffic was light.

Later, after Richard had passed, Arline got a Shadow 500 from her daughter-in-law and went to a BOCES

class in Ithaca to finally attain her license. Shortly thereafter, she was dazzled by a red Goldwing trike at the New York State Fair. Her son had given away the saddlebags for the Shadow, so Arline said she couldn't even carry as much as a purse with her when she rode. One rainy day she found herself at Bob's Cycle Shop looking to buy some saddlebags. And there on display was a red Goldwing trike for sale.

It was August 2004 and that red trike now belonged to Arline. As they drew up the paperwork, the people at Bob's Cycle encouraged her to join the local chapter of the Goldwing Road Riders Association. She attended a few of the chapter's breakfast meetings and struggled a bit to fit in since the members were all couples. But the chapter director always greeted her and made her feel welcome. Arline immediately put her organizational skills to work and suggested some streamlining to how the sign in process worked and she took to heart the need to be a welcoming chapter. When she became chapter director a few years later, she made sure new people felt included. She guided the team leaders to bring all issues to the table so they could be discussed in the open and an agreeable solution be found.

Arline developed this leadership style very early. She joined the Navy just a few months after high school graduation. She served almost two years in electronics before meeting a sailor, getting married, and having her first child. She says in those days pregnant women could not remain in the service.

Many years passed and there was finally an opportunity to realize her dream of going to college -

subsequently graduating from Broome Community College and going on to graduate from Watson School of Engineering at Binghamton University at the age of 50. This led to a job working as an engineer at Link Flight Simulation.

Arline also joined the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs and is still

involved after 40 years. She worked her way through the required two years as 2nd Vice President and two years as 1st Vice President to become eligible to become President. "I went through all the "chairs" and became President," she says. "I am good at raising my hand!" Later she became state treasurer for the organization and got invited by the state to several chairman positions. She says she has a resume for that organization that fills a whole page.

As one of three children, Arline was good at raising her hand very early on. She became a church organist at the age of 14 and taught piano in her home after she was married. She and her husband built their home where Arline still lives today. She laughs that her brother helped them for a few months but she says, "His idea of helping was to sit in a lawn chair and use a cable to raise up the bundles of shingles to me on the roof."

Arline has a soft heart for all canines. She says she has 14 dogs buried in her back hill – and two in the closet (that are cremated). Her most recent dog lived to almost 19 years old.



She laughs at the memories of the early years with the Goldwing chapter. She says it took three years before she knew everybody's name. Two of the members – Bob and Bill – she got mixed up until she took their pictures and wrote their names on the back of the pictures. She has seen the chapter go through a number of changes. First, Bob's Cycle burned down and a new sponsor needed to be found. Southern Tier Honda in Montour Falls, New York took over the task. Second, the chapter used to be much, much larger than it is today. When the group went to a state rally, they usually took up two or three tables, but now Arline has seen a number of her bike friends age out of the hobby. And third, The GoldWing Road Riders Association closed its doors in 2022 and the scramble was on to find a new national organization and provide public relations to keep members going strong. Wing'd Riders took on that task in 2023 and chapters are rebuilding. When the chapter needed a new place to hold their Gatherings, she investigated all the potential locations, and struck a deal with the Comfort Inn that has lasted now for nearly a decade.

Through it all Arline has not skipped a beat. She is now in charge of Pins and Patches for the chapter.


