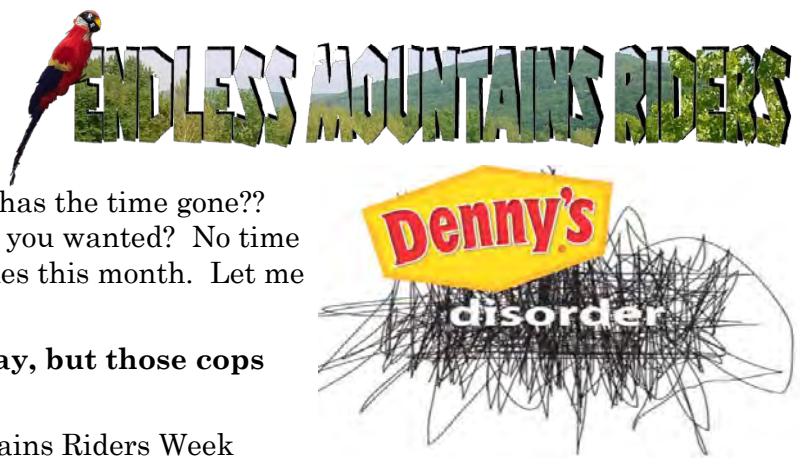

**I asked Barb, "Sweetheart, how do you turn Alexa off?" She replied, "Have you tried walking around the room naked?"**

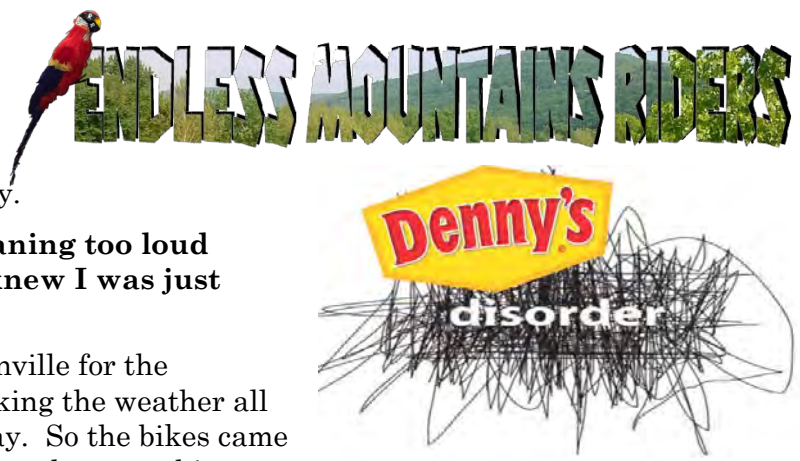

We stopped in Cumberland, MD for ice cream and got back to the Airbnb after 7 p.m. What a day!

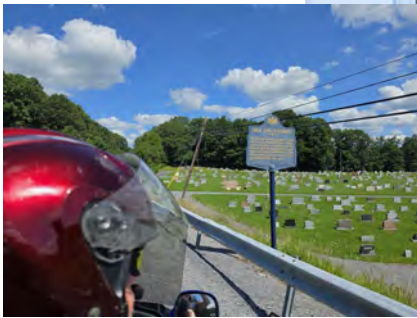

## District Vacation 2027

Sign up for a long District trip of fun!! The Endless Mountains Riders have planned a Chapter Vacation for the past six years. In 2026 we met up with folks from 3 other chapters and had so much fun that we decided to plan a DISTRICT vacation for 2027. Dates are currently tentative, but we have selected **Sunday, August 15 through Thursday, August 19** to start the planning. This is how the payment for the example of \$311/per person would work out:

\$100 deposit by Nov. 15, 2026

\$55.50 due upon reservation (sometime in December-January)

\$155.55 due July 30, 2027

These deposits are non-refundable, so be sure you want to go, and start reserving vacation time. 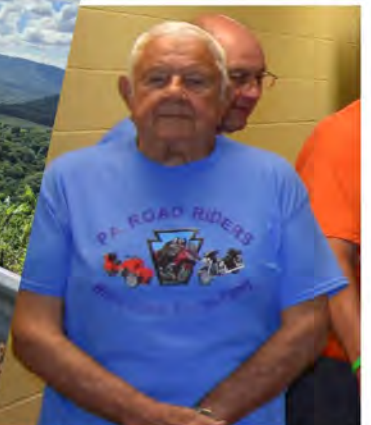
